

## Orchard City Council Regular Meeting, August 16, 2022

1. Call to Order and Announce a Quorum is Present: With a quorum of the Commissioners present, Mayor Rod Pavlock called the Regular Meeting of the Orchard City Council to order at 5:45 p.m. on Tuesday, August 16, 2022 in the Council Chambers of the Orchard City Hall, 9714 Kibler, Orchard, Texas.

2. Roll Call: Rod Pavlock, Mayor Matt Perreault, Commissioner Renee Wesbrooks, Commissioner Melissa Andel, City Secretary

- 3. Public Recognition: No one present
- 4. Commissioner Perreault made a motion to approve the minutes of the July 16<sup>th</sup> 2022 meeting. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 5. The four bids that were received on the trailer were opened. The highest bid of \$710.00 was notified that they received the trailer.
- 6. Robert Quarles introduced himself to council. He gave a short background of himself and the experience that he has. Commissioner Perreault made a motion that the city hire Robert Quarles on a month-to-month basis until December of 2022 at which time the city will revisit and see if Mr. Quarles is still a good fit for the city as City Administrator. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 7. Commissioner Perreault made a motion that the city purchase new cameras for the town center and city not spending more than \$15,000.00. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 8. Commissioner Perreault made a motion to approve the 2022/2023 proposed budget. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 9. Commissioner Perreault made a motion to increase the garbage rate \$1.00 effective immediately so that the city is not losing money on the trash service.. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 10. Commissioner Perreault made a motion for the city to have a proposed tax rate of \$0.40 / \$100.00 for the 2022 property taxes. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

- 11. Commissioner Perreault made a motion for the city to get a debit card on the water and sewer account from First National Bank of Bellville to help avoid audit issues. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 12. Still waiting on Fort bend County to give us the go ahead to start the next grant.
- 13. Commissioner Perreault made a motion to approve the July 2022 financial statements. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 14. Commissioner Perreault made a motion to approve the payment of bills for July 2022, which included a transfer of \$30,000.00 from general fund savings to general fund checking. Commissioner Wesbrooks seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. Mayor Pavlock abstained from check number 9149.
