

## Orchard City Council Regular Meeting, January 11, 2022

- 1. Call to Order and Announce a Quorum is Present: With a quorum of the Commissioners present, Mayor Rod Pavlock called the Regular Meeting of the Orchard City Council to order at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 11, 2022 in the Council Chambers of the Orchard City Hall, 9714 Kibler, Orchard, Texas.
- 2. Roll Call: Rod Pavlock, Mayor Joe Supak, Commissioner Matt Perreault, Commissioner Melissa Andel, City Secretary
- 3. Public Recognition: no one present
- 4. Commissioner Supak made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 14<sup>th</sup> 2021 regular meeting. Commissioner Perreault seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 5. Commissioner Perreault made a motion ordering a general election on May 7<sup>th</sup> 2022 for one mayor and two commissioner spots. Commissioner Supak seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- 6. The city will ask citizens for a right of way for properties along Hwy 36 so that Fuel Max can be in the city limits.
- 7. The city is working with Rise Broadband to see if fiber optic is an option for the city.
- 8. The city is currently working 3 different grants all of which will improve the water infrastructure and its possible future growth.
- 9. There are no new code enforcement issues.
- 10. Commissioner Perreault made a motion to approve the December financial statements.
- 11. Commissioner Supak made a motion to approve the payment of bills and transfer for the month of December in the amount of \$30,000.00: on \$15,000.00 on 12/1/2021 and \$15,000.00 on 12/28/2021. Commissioner Supak abstained from check number 8042 and 8043, Mayor Pavlock abstained from check number 9037. Commissioner Perreault seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
